NAPA Annual Convention THE FUTURE OF TRANSPORTATION FUNDING

As I write this, I have just returned from the NAPA Annual Convention where the mood was optimistic and the theme was centered on the future of transportation funding. If you have read my last couple of installments, you are aware that President Trump highlighted rebuilding infrastructure during his campaign, again on election night and as part of his inauguration address. In Donald J. Trump's Contract with the American Voter, he proposes the American Energy and Infrastructure Act, which would leverage public-private partnerships and private investments through tax incentives, to spur \$1 trillion in infrastructure investment over ten years. The Democrats have countered with an infrastructure plan of their own that is of the same magnitude; however, it is hard to make a comparison due to lack of details. With that in mind, we have a rare opportunity where the stars may be starting to align and there is a window of opportunity for a substantial increase

in transportation funding that we may never see again. I urge you to get involved. At the bare minimum, contact your United States Senators and Representatives and urge them to support increased funding. On May 17-18, the Transportation Construction Coalition (TCC) will host the TCC Fly-In. This is a great opportunity to meet face to face with your elected officials and discuss infrastructure funding. I would strongly urge you to consider joining us in Washington DC this year as we have this unique opportunity for a significant increase in infrastructure investment. If you are interested in attending, please contact the MAPA office.

On the state front, we still need to stay engaged. At this point in the legislative session, there has been nothing debated that relates to increased funding for infrastructure and Governor Greitens has remained relatively quiet on the subject as well. We do, however, plan to have a legislative day at the State Capitol. Stay tuned for more information. Even though there is not a bill to discuss, it's important that we show up to remind our legislators that the funding problem has not gone away and that we may need to be prepared to be able to match an increase in federal funds if the \$1 trillion plan comes to fruition. 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Invitation to Apply 2017-2018 MAPA SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION NOW OPEN



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
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Official Opening ASPHALT LAB AT MIZZOU MADE POSSIBLE BY THE GENEROSITY OF MAPA MEMBERS

It's finally here! On behalf of my colleagues at Mizzou, and the Missouri Asphalt Pavement Association, we are very happy to announce the official opening of a world-class asphalt research and instruction laboratory in the newly renovated laboratory and instructional facility in Lafferre Hall on the University of Missouri-Columbia campus. On January 11, 2017, members of MAPA participated in a sneak peek of the new asphalt lab, which is operational and quickly being filled with industrystandard and cutting-edge asphalt binder and mixture testing equipment. A formal grand opening event and asphalt symposium will be held on Monday, March 27, 2017, and all MAPA members are cordially invited to attend (invitations/ details to be sent directly to members). The MAPA-sponsored asphalt lab, located in C2217 Lafferre Hall, is the centerpiece of the new Missouri Asphalt Pavement and Innovation Laboratory program, or 'MAPIL.' MAPIL is a collection of 4 labs, 2 on campus and 2 located at the nearby Discovery Park on US-63, which collectively focus on research in asphalt materials, flexible and composite pavements, and innovative, intelligent, and sustainable transportation infrastructure. Through the generosity of members of MAPA, the Glen Barton family, and the University of Missouri/State of Missouri, MAPIL is off to a great start with an equipment and facility value of approximately \$3M, placing it among the world's most comprehensive asphalt programs. The lab features cutting-edge binder tests, such as advanced dynamic mechanical analysis capabilities, and mixture tests, including new cracking, fatigue, and rutting apparatus. The lab has been designed and staffed to support research stemming from local, state, and federal agencies, while being able to respond to time-sensitive industry testing needs. In addition to research and testing, MAPIL will help deliver undergraduate and graduate asphalt and pavement courses and will develop and offer continuing education programs for the asphalt community.
