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Quality in Construction Paving Awards Program

The Missouri Asphalt Pavement Association is proud to recognize quality asphalt projects completed throughout the state of Missouri. Awards will be given to winners and runners-up of outstanding projects in a total of nine categories. Project contractors, owners, and engineers will receive recognition for the effort required to produce such high quality work.

All projects submitted to the Paving Awards program must have been completed in the past 12 months with the exception of the Longevity Award. Submissions will be judged on the following criteria: smoothness, longitudinal joints, segregation, degree of difficulty, innovative practices, uniqueness of the project, and overall quality. Please see the categories below, determine which your project falls under, and fill out all fields in the application (this includes pictures of the project).
